Case Management and Community Care Programs

The **Case Management Program** is designed to assist frail adults ages 60 and above with resources and services available so their functional abilities are maximized and they are able to remain independent as long as possible. A comprehensive needs assessment is done to include medical, financial, emotional, and functional information. An individual plan of care is then designed to respond to the needs of the client and the family. Ongoing evaluations and quality assurance are done on a regular basis. This program runs year round and is available in Crawford, Jasper, Lawrence, and Richland counties.

The **Community Care Program** was acquired by Wabash Area Development, Inc. October 2001 from the Embarras River Basin Agency. WADI manages the Community Care Program in Richland, Crawford, Jasper, Lawrence, Hamilton, White, Wayne, Wabash and Edwards counties. It is designed to assist the case managers in identifying and arranging for the needed services for seniors or the disabled, age 60 and above.

Homemaker services are available by providing a homemaker the assistance with everyday tasks to remain independent as long as possible. Services are provided based upon the needs of the client. Case Managers work closely with all agencies within their counties to assure that our Senior Citizens are getting the services that will help them remain independent in their own home.

Headstart Program

Headstart is a Child Development Program providing comprehensive educational and health services to preschool children (3-5 years old) of low-income families. At least 10% of the children must have a special need.

Program services include a variety of developmentally appropriate experiences that foster intellectual, social, emotional and physical growth.

A comprehensive health care program includes medical, dental, mental health and nutritional services as follows: vision and hearing screening; immunizations; identification of special needs; dental exam and follow-up care.

Children are served hot lunch and a nutritional breakfast/snack each day.

Parents are involved in program planning and operating activities and are eligible to receive cash incentives for completing the GED and/or college classes. Families are assisted in obtaining services from local agencies.

Transportation is provided to Headstart sites for most children.

The Headstart program is funded by the Department of Health and Human Services.
